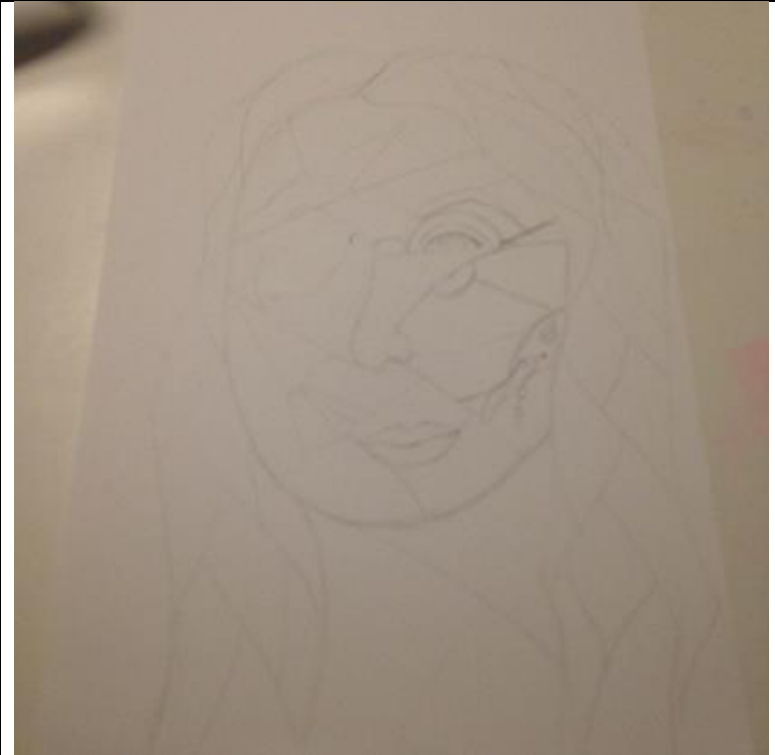
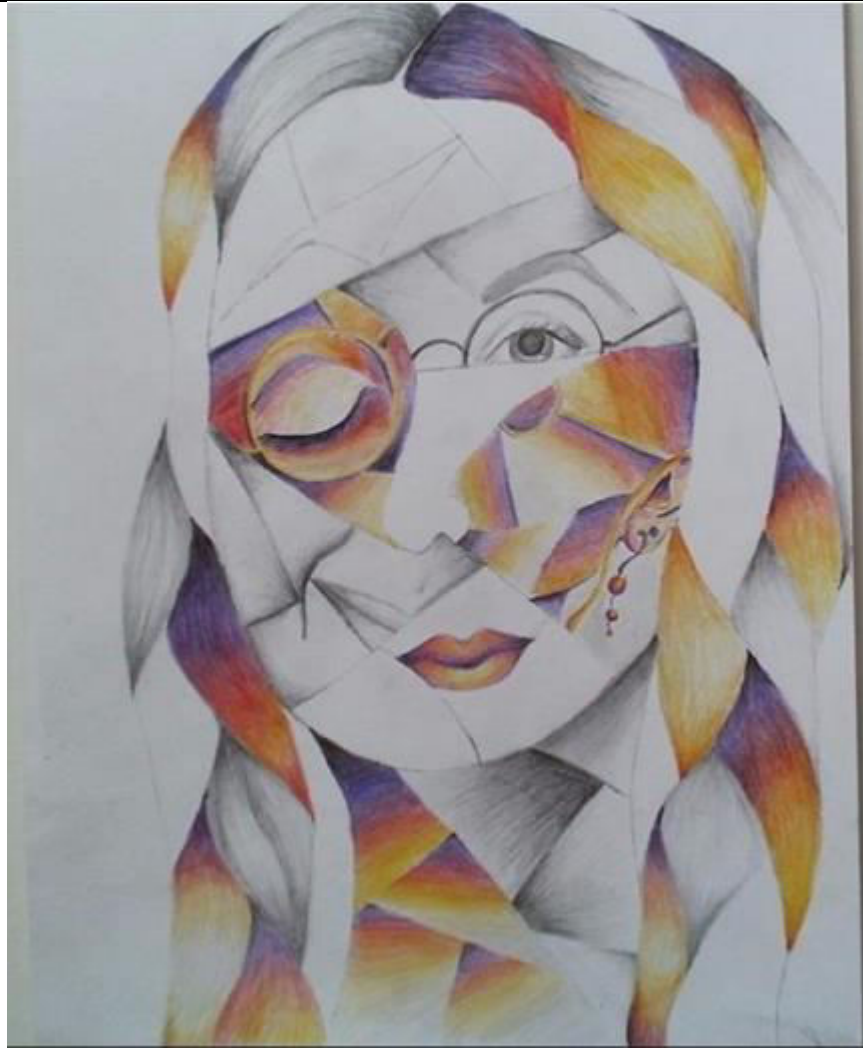
The work includes videos featuring teacher instruction. These are all in the All Resources folders or available via direct links in this document.
