### Year 11 Assessments – Commencing 10<sup>th</sup> May

In order for us to have the widest possible range of reliable, recent and consistent evidence to inform our grading judgements, all pupils will complete one more short assessment for each of their subjects.

These assessments will take place starting from 10<sup>th</sup> May. To support our pupils who will be celebrating Eid, we will not schedule assessments on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> and Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> May.

The assessments will be conducted in test conditions with all pupils sitting the same assessment at the same time for each course. For example, all of Year 11 will sit their English literature assessment at the same time so no one can be advantaged by knowing what specific questions are going to be asked. Where pupils are entered for exams with tiers (higher/foundation) everyone on that tier will sit their paper together, which may be at a different time to the other tier.

Although we are not permitted to provide pupils with the exam questions themselves, we are permitted to share with them the topics that will be featured on these assessments. This will enable them to focus their revision. These details will be shared with pupils and, if you want to see them for yourself, a link to these details will be posted on our website by the end of this week. We are in a fortunate position compared with some other schools because we have conducted several larger assessments recently with the whole cohort. This means that this final assessment will be substantially smaller than previous assessments, lasting **no more than 45 minutes** for each subject. There will be only **one assessment per subject**.

Rest assured that the performance on any one assessment will not determine an overall grade by itself. The full range of evidence will be taken into account.
