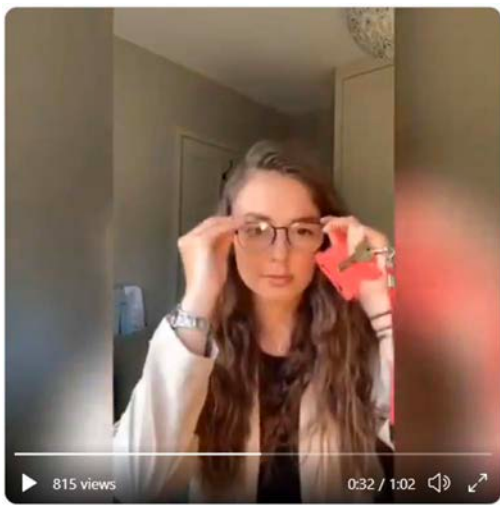

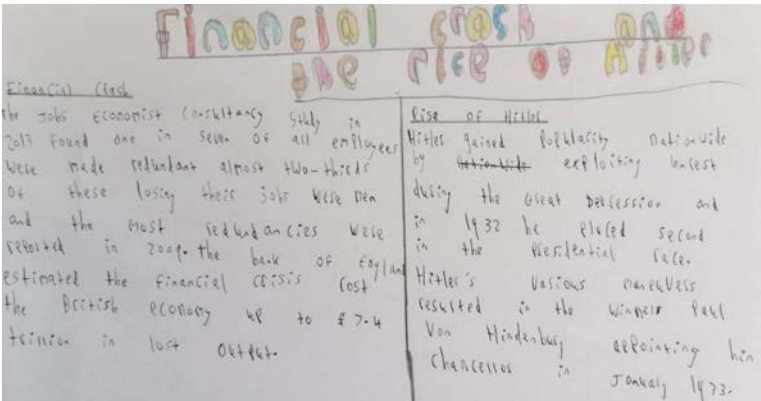

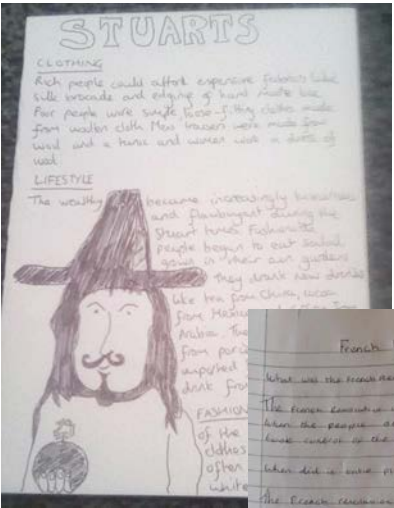


KEY STAGE 3 HISTORY WORK

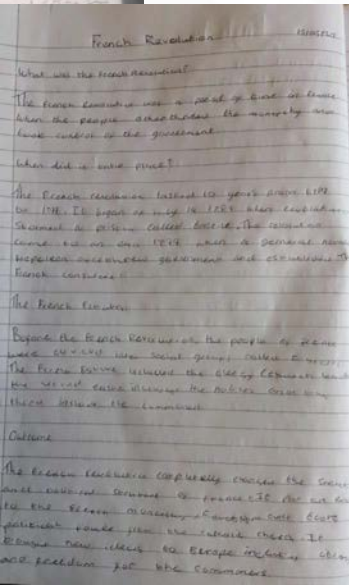
Pupils have really been impressing their history teachers with the work they have been sending in. Here is a small selection of work three pupils have sent over Teams or e-mail.



Grace's (Year 8) work on the 1929 financial crash and the rise of Hitler.

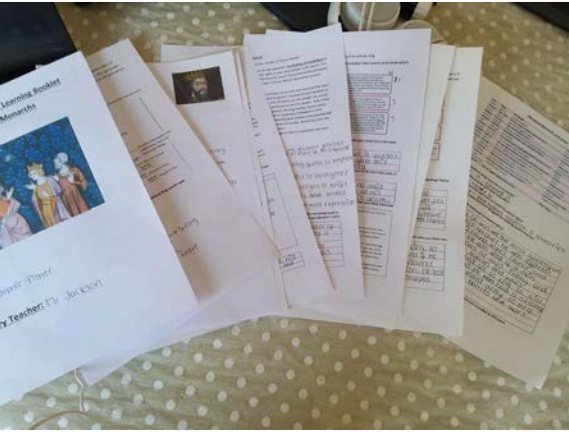


Harvey's (Year 7) work on the Stuarts.

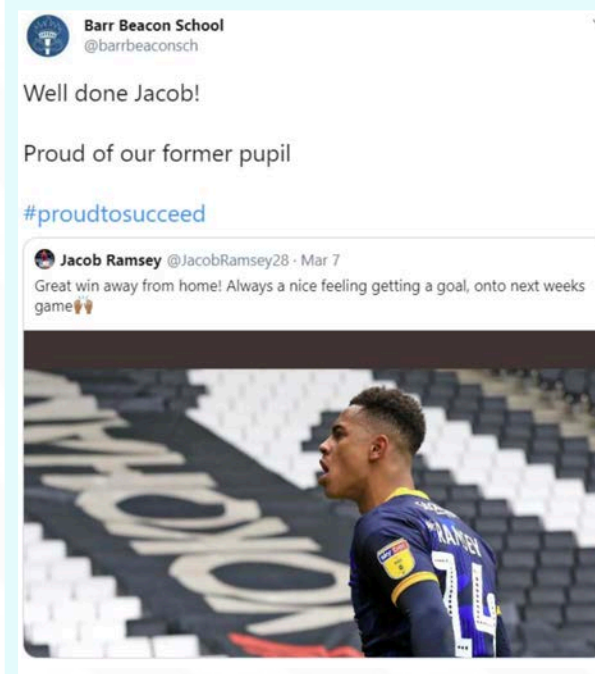

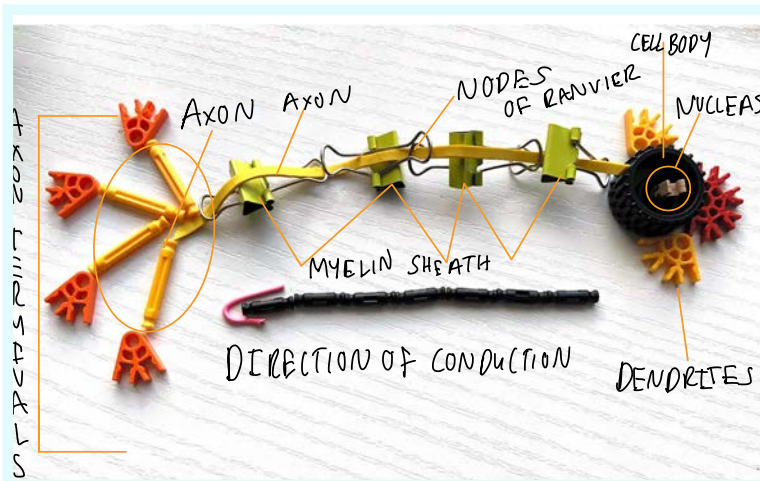
MAKING A NEURON AT HOME

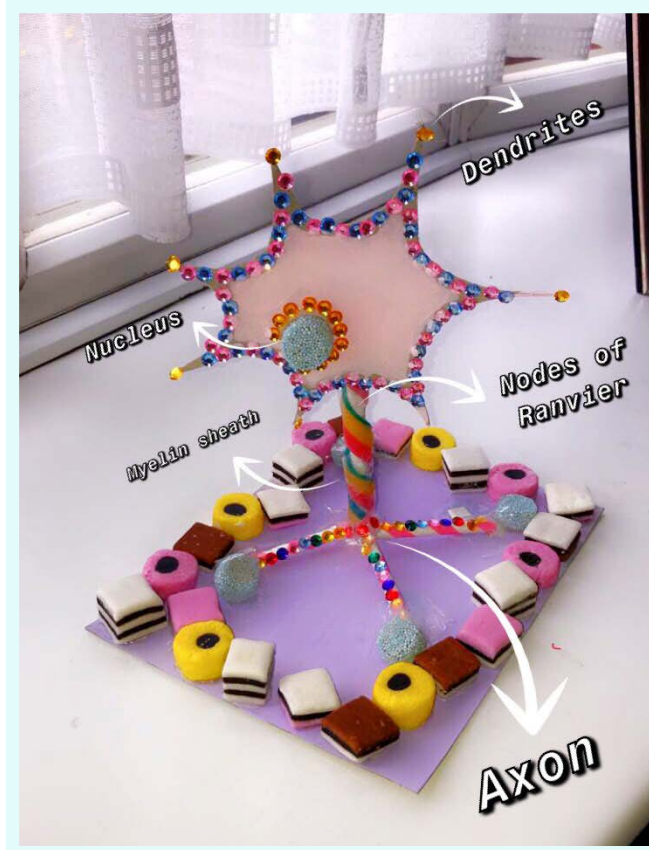

NATIONAL THANK A TEACHER DAY 20TH MAY 2020

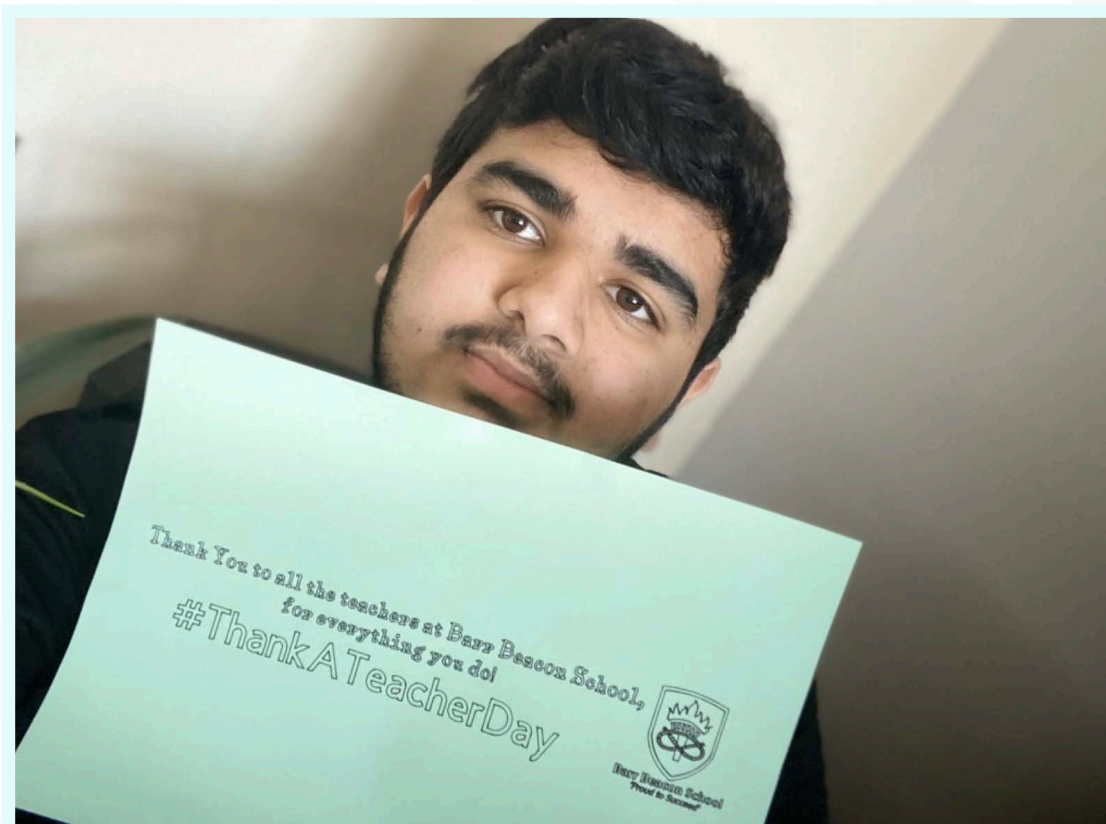

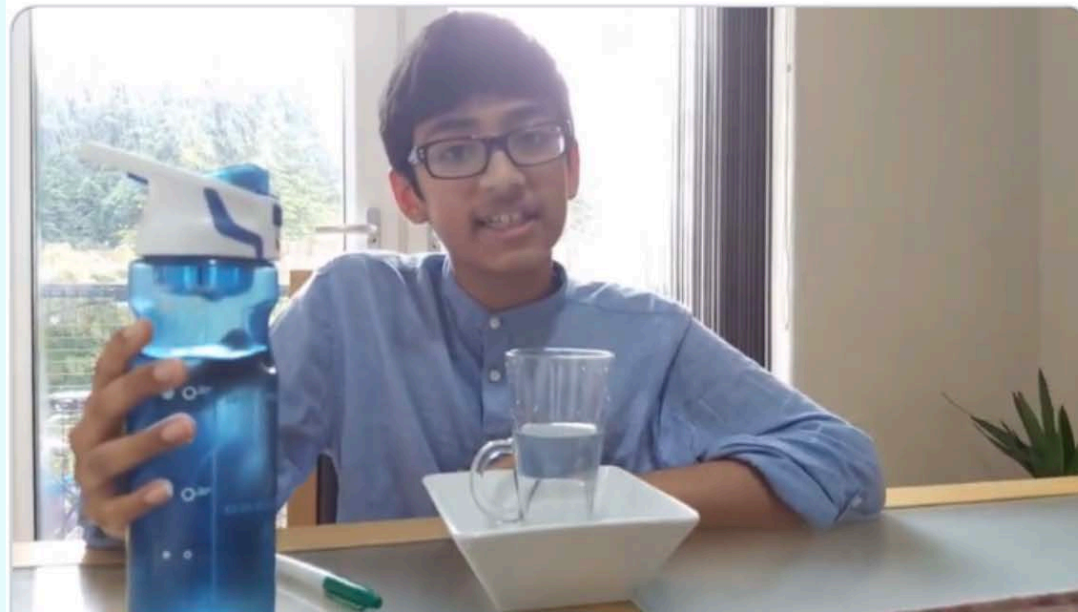

IS YOUR CHILD ENTITLED TO FREE SCHOOL MEALS?

If you receive any of the following benefits, your child/children may be entitled to free school meals:

- Income Support
- Income Based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
- Guarantee Element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have a gross annual income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after April 1st 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Children who receive these benefits directly, instead of through a parent or guardian, can also get a free school meal.
